

What kind of data does MMP collect?

- MMP gathers data from face-to-face interviews and medical records.
- In 2011–2012, 501 people receiving HIV medical care in Oregon participated in MMP.


Who receives care in Oregon?

- 85% identify as male
- 59% identify as gay and 9% as bisexual
- 45% are age 50+
- 67% have at least some college education
- 26% work full-time and 8% part-time
- 30% live outside the Portland metro area

Are people living with HIV getting the services they need?

MMP asks participants about their medical and social service needs in 16 service categories. Participants are first asked if they received a specific service. If they did not receive that service, they are asked if they needed the service. Participants who needed but did not receive a service are asked the main reason why they could not get that service.

MMP 2011–2012**




CARE Assist clients were significantly more likely than non-clients to report higher needs for many key services such as HIV case management, counseling to prevent the spread of HIV, housing, mental health services, public benefits, meal or food services, and transportation assistance.



How many unmet needs did people have?

Half of participants reported at least one unmet medical or social service need.

Who had at least one unmet medical need?

People reporting at least one unmet need in the core medical services (including dental and behavioral health services) were significantly more likely to exhibit the following characteristics:

Demographics

- Homeless in the past 12 months;
- Unemployed or working only side jobs.

HIV-related health care

- Received HIV care in the ER/urgent care/hospital;
- Most recent CD4 count below 200 cells/mm³;
- Not currently taking ARTs or missed a dose in the prior three days.

Health behaviors

- Current smoker;
- Major depressive symptoms in the past two weeks;
- Medical marijuana use in the past 12 months;
- Injection drug use in the past 12 months.
