<p>Introductions – June – 5 min Overall Orpheus- Stephen – 15 min</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Survey results: About 100 people responded to last month’s survey – About 80% were satisfied with Orpheus, and about 20% were not. The new server hasn’t resulted in better perceived performance. There is very little overlap between Orpheus users and Oregon Public Health Assessment Tool (OPHAT). About 30 state and local respondents (from 9 different counties) were willing to use a smart phone to authenticate instead of a fob. 		Fobs will be deployed over the next several weeks.

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ELR updates –Michelle - 10 min

New developments with 4 labs that are waiting to be approved:

- **Mid Columbia** (started sending 9/11) are hoping to stop faxing.
- **Silverton Hospital**
- **Asante** {Rogue Valley, Three Rivers, and Ashland hospitals} (upgraded their message in early October).
- **Salem Hospital**

Other Updates:

- **Willamette Valley Medical Center** is actively testing and hoping to go live within the next few months
- **Kaiser** is working frantically to fix their messages and hope to be back to normal by the first of the year
- **Saint Alphonsus** and **Sky Lakes** are also in early development

New Feature – Duplicate ELR button for Gonorrhea/Chlamydia ELRs

- You now have the ability to duplicate ELRs that come in with paired tests (e.g., Gonorrhea/Chlamydia). Go to the More Tab of the ELR Patient Detail and use the Duplicate CD ELR button (see figure below).

- Remember to **UNCHECK** the Confirmed or Presumptive check box when searching for persons under monitoring, the find feature **automatically** looks for confirmed or presumptive cases only so you will have to uncheck this

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Home screen timed refresh – should speed up loading of home page -- June

We've received a lot of negative feedback about performance lags when navigating back to the home screen. The navigation is dependent on various parameters, including number of cases that need to be refreshed on your home screen filter, new ELRs showing up on your home screen, etc.
