<p>1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Feedback from Counties: <p>Clatsop – frequent case transfer problems, no information shows when linking on the transfers</p> <p>Curry – ok</p> <p>Douglas – (Karen and Keita) Some screen freezes (worked ok after re-boot), daily slowness</p>	<p>Counties to continue e-mailing tech team re: disconnections.</p>

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	<p>Hood River (Lindy) –sluggishness.</p> <p>Jefferson (Joy) – No disconnects, but frequent sluggishness, e.g., changing screens, going to the home page, especially “today”</p> <p>Linn (Debby) – Slow, not keeping up with the typing.</p> <p>Multnomah – (Aura and Perry) – slow, occasional disconnects, including 2 “today”. Perry has had several disconnects/day and experiencing slowness.</p> <p>June asked if users have been experiencing problems in clearing the address of the person record with the clear address button, or if the practice is typing over the address? The Clear Address button is now working.</p>	
<p>2</p>	<p>Security Policy Update – Stephen</p> <p>We’ve incorporated CDC’s recommendations for HIV Confidentiality. A lot of the changes will be reflected in the revised Security Audit, including documentation of where the data are exported, and documentation of County-specific policies.</p> <p>Many Counties have their own security policies, including HIPAA-related polices.</p>	<p>State to send Security Audits and updated policies to County Overall Responsible Parties with clear directions.</p>

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
<p>3</p>	<p>ELR Update – Michelle</p> <p>State has some internal control measures to catch either errors in transmission, or errors in actual messages. For example, Rob Laing caught and fixed an error with a Kaiser Lab, before the error was transmitted to Counties.</p> <p>ELR Team is committed to make this the year of data quality and is reaching out to labs to give them input about the quality of their messages, e.g., missing patient phone numbers, incorrectly-coded lab tests, quality and timeliness of their lab messages, etc.</p> <p>Plan is drafted but not implemented.</p> <p>Q: Perry of Multnomah asked about a scenario that comes up: They receive an elevated lead level report on a child and they're informed by the parent that the child was tested at hospital, e.g., Providence, but that they don't see the ELR lab, who should they notify? A: Notify the lab if that's your standard practice, but be sure to inform Michelle or Rob Laing. It's possible they may have sent something that's been miscoded and filtered from view and can be solved at the State. Further, if they should be sending something they're not, Michelle has a direct line to their technical people, who can solve the problem.</p>	<p>State to implement the ELR quality control plan.</p>

There are new Epi Curves in the Graphs Tab of Orpheus Reports.




Move report button to a more obvious place in Orpheus.

Matt cautioned that the report table is usually a day behind the case data.


June clarified the difference between a Report Search vs. Case Search.

Q. How do you find a syphilis case from another county when you only have the information on the case's contact? Use the contact search feature.

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

<p>5</p>	<p>Blood Lead Update – Environmental Sampling – Dave Dreher Dave has been receiving calls (Lane and Washington Counties) about environmental sampling results. Dave is still sorting through the process. The person responsible for getting these results to the County, Barbara Zeal, is no longer with the State.</p>	<p>Counties to let Dave know if your County has had environmental sampling results since July of last year, but hasn't received results.</p> <p>Dave to query via e-mail the Orpheus users who have access to the blood lead module.</p>
<p>6</p>	<p>“Date of Record” – Will it work for all reports? – June</p> 	

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	<p>June asked if Counties would like to get rid of specific date types, e.g., Onset, Report, Diagnosis, etc.</p>	<p>Counties to let June know whether Date of Record will suffice for the reports layout.</p>
<p>7</p>	<p>Provider “clean up” – June A workgroup comprising of Karen Vian, Julie Hatch, Matt Navarre, June Bancroft, and Doug Harger have begun to “clean” provider data table for Douglas County. June has done similar work with Benton County, e.g., consolidating the 8 entries for Oregon State University into one record, which was a long process. Since then, the process has become a little more formalized.</p> <p>June reviewed the following drop down list of provider “types” to verify that the list represents the totality of possible provider categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provider - Hospital - ER - Lab - Clinic/Office - Care facility (newly added for MDROs) Rehab centers and long term care facilities would go here - Vet Clinic 	<p>Care Facility is preferred to Long Term Care as there are many different levels of Care Facilities.</p>

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	<p>-</p> <p>Q: Does the Provider mean the individual? Yes, but we're still attempting to define these.</p> <p>Consensus was reached that "Hospital Labs" can be called Labs, and that Hospital ERs can be called ERs.</p> <p>Consensus was reached that Labs do not need to be further distinguished whether original or testing lab, etc. Just denoting "Lab" is ok.</p> <p>Q: How do we deal with Prisons and Jails? Use the provider, not the institution. Karen Vian referred to the County Jail as a "clinic."</p> <p>Q: Where should Urgent Care Clinics go? Under Clinics/Office</p> <p>Matt stated that the provider module is supposed to be used house data on individuals treating the case; he suggested using another field for storing data, such as jail or prison data, that is associated with the case.</p>	<p>Consensus is needed regarding jails and prisons. Once we've reached consensus, we need to assure that Karen's instructions are updated.</p> <p>Consensus is needed regarding Vet Clinic category. The currently proposal is to put the Vet in the Provider category, and the Vet Clinic in the Clinics/Office category.</p>
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<p>8</p>	<p>Upcoming training sessions – June June and Hillary are planning on a regional training on Orpheus, Outbreaks, and GI Case log in the Eugene area.</p> <p>Sleuth, a point source outbreak application, is being replaced by Napoli, Bill Keene’s last database.
