Topic	Action Items
<p>1. Overall Orpheus – Stephen - 5 min 160 fobs expired on 12/31/2014. We deployed 127 to the Counties. About 25 (20%) of 127 have yet to activate their fobs.</p> <p>We're in the first phase of our new contract with Matt, which includes 6 major bugs, including Contact Management, Speeding navigation, Improving ELR linking, improving Notes editing, improving Contact Transfers, exporting data to CDC, security auditing, Syphilis Reactor management, analytical SQL file for Tri-County.</p>	<p>Counties to continue to communicate with State their Orpheus needs.</p>

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<p>2.</p>	<p>ELR updates –Michelle - 10 min</p> <p>June found a glitch yesterday with regard to data being sent from Kaiser. Apparently a few files were missed. Michelle also has a request into Salem Health, which hasn't sent us anything since Dec 16th. Kaiser is still faxing. Salem is not.</p> <p>Q: Heather from Deschutes asked about Peace Health ELRs, which often doesn't include patient address information. They're often not Deschutes County residents and often have to call to get more information, which takes a lot of extra time. Originating lab (BMC) actually sends the demographic information to Peace Health.</p> <p>This is a known problem with Peace Health, which is acting as a reference lab in this context. Peace Health has told us that we can have timely or complete information, but we can't have both. This is due to the way they process their incoming specimens and accompanying information associated with them. The test information gets entered into a different information system than the demographic information, which is their billing system. Peace Health is improving their system, but they're still about a year out in being able to fix this problem.</p> <p>Q: Kathy from Klamath asked if the Lab is required by law to give the information if they're queried by Public Health? Yes.</p> <p>Michelle is getting ready to send her annual "you're required by law to send complete information" letter.</p> <p>The Orpheus algorithm starts with Patient Address, then Provider Address, etc.</p>	<p>Michelle to review the OARs and get follow up with Heather.</p>
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
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	<p>The lab that reports to the provider is required by law to report to the County of Residence. Since the reports are coming from Peace Health, they would be required to report to the County.</p> <p>Kathleen from Malheur has her Medical Director get involved when medical facilities are not cooperating, which quickly solves the problem.</p>	
3.	<p>ELR reports – test labs and encrypted names - June – 5 min</p> <p>Sometimes ELRs come through with encrypted names, e.g., employee health screening from Providence. The issue occurs when the lab gets to the wrong County, or someone creates a case in Orpheus with the encrypted name instead of the real name, thus causing a duplicate case.</p> <p>BEST PRACTICE: FOR REAL CASES, DO NOT CREATE A CASE USING AN ENCRYPTED NAME; FOLLOW UP WITH THE LABORATORY TO GET THE REAL NAME. DO NOT IGNORE THE TEST.</p>	
4.	<p>Developer Update – Matt.</p> <p>Disappearing Contact Transfers – multi-factorial problem, a big part of which had to do with the differing ways one can transfer a contact in Orpheus. Now, there’s only one way to transfer a contact.</p>	


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		<p>Counties to follow up with each other by phone to verify that transfer happened, and to notify Orpheus Tech Team whenever a contact transfer (or any type of transfer, for that matter!) doesn't work for whatever reason.</p>
<p>5.</p>	<p>Running reports to fill out Outbreak summary reports on reportable diseases - 10 min June – For reportable disease conditions you can run Orpheus reports that will capture most of the information that you need to enter into the outbreak summary record.</p> <p>Go to Orpheus reports and choose age group by sex report, it will become bolded. Make sure you remove dates and check the advanced find box</p>	<p>State to consider creating a training video on this process.</p> <p>In the window that opens go to the advanced tab and enter the outbreak ID number</p>


