<p>Introductions - June - 5 min</p> <p>ELR updates –Michelle - 10 min Lane county alerted state to issue with Peace Health. Sent a bunch of non reportable results. Now resolved. Vibrio species identified, but nothing identified. Some issues with coding. Linn county identified processing problem with St Charles. ELR was hung up. If you receive a fax and did not get an ELR we would like to know about them.</p> <p>Faxes from Kaiser should have stopped– Heather in ACDP still getting faxes. Would say “plan C” fax on the top of the fax report.</p> <p>Perry in Multnomah – gets a fair number of transfers. Should he be accepting these? Yes else it goes back to the county that transferred it to you.</p>		

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Working with Multnomah to get TB data from their Epic System. Woman's Health Care Associates. Working on some clinical information from them. This would be similar to and ELR but would be a clinic message. Heather asked about Epic and TB data. Using model for TB will see how importing data into Orpheus would be. This would reduce the amount of double data entry.

New county review reports – Tasha - 15 min

Demoed the new county review reports. Still in the same location. The old interface with start and end dates are still used for cleaning data. There is a new tab for printable reports.

The user will only be able to select their county.

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New metrics are included – verify vaccination status for hepatitis cases. If you enter the vaccines and assess whether they are up to date, check the box at the top of the vaccine tab. You also will be credited if you hit the query Alert button.

Question as to whether you get credit if you query alert but do not get anything returned, yes. If you check the box up to date, this also counts as having asked. If click up to date, do the LHDs need to enter all the vaccines? Yes if you have them you might want to but for hepatitis not reviewing individual cases. Also measuring contacts with vaccines for hepatitis. See arrows for these fields. There are also fields for up to date and query alert for contacts. Date of contact interview will also be tracked.

Adding animal bites to the county review tool, but this will be done separately. If you are using Orpheus for animal bites we have some metrics that will be reported on. Clarified that some counties do not do animal bites with CD. These will not be measured unless you use Orpheus for animal bites.

We will be creating some documentation on how to run the new reports.

Alert query is not working – Multnomah mentioned that if hit query alert two times. This seems to work for them. Michelle will look into the need to click this twice.

New instructions will be created for the new report tool

Timeliness measures – will be using ELR report date to Case creation date. Also adding time LHD report to contact interview. Days to first interview attempt for all enteric pathogens. Outbreak measures have also been built into the new county review tool. Any feedback should be directed to Tasha. Case log submission metric and number of stool kits distributed (not collected). The other metrics are the same as before.

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Request for conditional formatting of the stool kits distributed check box. Will send out the new tool once it is finalized. It has been reviewed by CLHO, we are working on incorporating the fields into Orpheus and Outbreaks.

Previously when clean data and want to run the report – would have to refresh overnight. If you make some small changes you can click refresh facts – and it will tell you how long it would take to rerun the reports.

Data QA/QC – review – June – 5 min

Reviewed the clean data features (on other report tools). Recommended that this is done on a routine basis to clean your data.

Cleaning data line list allows you to navigate to the record and enter the data that is missing. Also reviewed unprocessed ELR query – to find any ELR reports that did not get processed. This could be due to a delay in the ELR from the lab and then later they come through. June also reviewed how to batch match cases to ELRs if you have a large volume of unprocessed labs.

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Contact transfers – June – 5 min

Make sure that you have default days set both on ELR, Contacts, Cases etc. You set these in your default user settings. If this is blank records will show up and then quickly disappear.

Trainings – June - 5 min

Recent - CRE and NTM and animal bites- highlights – very good training, and will be doing the same training at Or Epi. Even if your CRE is not carbapenemase producing it is reportable.

Animal bites training – animal bites are bite exposures, animal rabies is where you would enter this as an animal rabies case. The bat would be the subject of the report for animal rabies.

Other training topics? June training webinar (June 1st – hepatitis) July training webinar is STD focused – July 6th.

Mary from Benton requested online TB training. Russ Barlow is willing to go on site for training. Both regular and latent TB training. Lane county also interested in this.

Douglas county requested a review of what the HIV program does and what is expected from the counties.
