# INTRODUCTION


The 2006 Oregon Licensed Facilities Report provides statewide licensing and inspection information for all food service establishments, public pools, public spas and tourist accommodations. Each local public health authority provides their data annually to the Department of Human Services' (DHS) Food, Pool & Lodging Health and Safety Section for this report. Counties that did not submit data show information pulled directly from the statewide inspection software.

Data regarding standardized county staff and CPO-equivalent certifications is from the DHS database only. Some counties may have taken their pool operator courses from a private contractor.

This year's report has been drastically changed to a more user-friendly format with a page per county instead of the pages of Excel charts included historically. The raw data in the previous format are included in the annex of this report. It is also available online at: [www.healthoregon.org/foodsafety](http://www.healthoregon.org/foodsafety). All graphs included in this report are informational and not designed to draw specific conclusions about the data represented.


# INTRODUCTION



The above graph shows how Oregon's licensed facilities are distributed statewide. It is interesting to note that Harney county is the largest county geographically in Oregon with only 70 facilities, while Multnomah county is the smallest, but has the most facilities at 3,924.

### Specific areas for improvement statewide are:

- Introducing self to the operator prior to starting inspection and providing a business card

- Observing the food handlers during the inspection to be sure they are washing their hands and handling foods appropriately
- Asking about procedures for cleaning in place equipment such as slicers, cutting boards and culinary sinks
- Asking about availability, use, calibration and cleaning of probe thermometers
- Checked refrigerators for thermometers
- Asking operators about their use of sanitizer test strips
- Asking about the facility's procedures for cleaning equipment
- Taking final cooking temperatures of food along the cookline
- Asking about glove use, employee illness policies and watch for proper habits
- Asking about catering activities in the facility
- Asking the PIC if they have access to the Oregon Sanitation Rules
- Checking that food service workers have a food handler card onsite






## 1. Please rate the overall performance of the Foodborne Illness Prevention Program consultation unit




## 2. Please rate the quality of technical advice you receive from the food consultation staff



**3. Please rate the response time of the food consultation unit to your requests**




**19. Which category most closely matches your job classification?**




## 9. Please rate the overall performance of the swimming pool program consultation staff




## 10. Please rate the overall performance of the tourist accommodation program consultation staff




**11. How do you rate the quality of technical advice you receive from the swimming pool consultation staff?**
