


Non-Immigrants


A person who enters the country is allowed to stay in the United States for a specific reason and for a limited amount of time. The person must have a permanent residence abroad (for most classes of admission) and qualify for the non-immigrant classification sought. The non-immigrant classifications include, but are not limited to: foreign government officials, visitors for business and for pleasure, persons in transit through the United States, treaty traders and investors, students, international representatives, temporary workers and trainees, representatives of foreign information media, exchange visitors, fiancé(e)s of U.S. citizens, intracompany transferees, NATO officials, and religious workers. Spouses and unmarried minor (or dependent) children can accompany or join the non-immigrant.



Refugees/Asylees

Refugee – A person outside their country of nationality who is unable or unwilling to return to that country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution. Refugees are eligible to adjust to lawful permanent resident status after one year of continuous presence in the United States. Unlike asylees, refugees apply for and receive this status prior to entry into the United States. This status is covered by Section 207 of the INA.

Asylee – A person in the United States or at a port of entry who is found to be unable or unwilling to return to their country of nationality, or to seek the protection of that country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution. Asylees are eligible to adjust to lawful permanent resident status after one year of continuous presence in the United States. Section 208 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA) covers this status.

Naturalized/Derived U.S. Citizens

Naturalized citizen - a person who wasn't born in the U.S. or acquired U.S. citizenship automatically through his or her relationship to a U.S. citizen. Naturalization is the process by which U.S. citizenship is granted to a foreign citizen or national after fulfilling the requirements established by law.

Derived citizen - a person who derives U.S. citizenship through his or her relationship to a U.S. citizen by operation of law. May be conveyed to children through the naturalization of the children's parents, through passage of certain laws, or through adoption of foreign-born children by U.S. citizen parents.
