## **CCare & Private Insurance**

We want to remind everyone that clients who have private insurance may still be eligible for CCare. In fact, we encourage clients with private insurance, who meet CCare eligibility requirements, to enroll in CCare. Private insurance must still be billed first (if the client doesn't have any confidentiality concerns), but enrolling clients allows clinics to balance bill CCare for services and supplies related to pregnancy prevention.
