HB 2626

- Capital grants for SBHC acquisition, construction, or improvement (*\$4 million/10-12 grants*)

SB 336

- Parity (*\$952,000*)
- Planning Grants (*\$900,000/10 grants*)
- Technical assistance for planning in high need communities (*\$97,000*)

THANK YOU to all of the youth, SBHC Coordinators, mental health specialists, school- and community-partners who worked on CORE grants this year:

- **Ashland High School** – Worked closely with YAC to promote healthy youth relationships through a series of “Tinkle Time” newsletters in school bathroom stalls; developed a collaborative partnership with nursing student interns at Southern Oregon University to launch a potential project on social exclusion bullying at Ashland Middle School and Ashland High School
- **Butte Falls Charter School** - implemented a school policy change increasing the consequences of sexual harassment and adding language regarding sexual assault
- **Eagle Point High School** - engaged their peers in a school-wide Healthy Youth Relationships Day, which integrated messages promoting SBHC services and hours
- **Prospect Charter School** – teaming up with the students at Butte Falls to present at OSBHA’s upcoming youth summit: Demand Respect – A Summit on Healthy Relationships
- **Pendleton High School** – working with the GSA to plan a series of events promoting healthy LGBTQ relationships
