- To link the work you do with the outcome you achieve
- Demonstrate effective use of resources
- Funding
- Improve programs

2 basic evaluation questions:

- Did you carry out your local program plan?
- ☐ Did you achieve your objectives?

What are we demonstrating?

- Process: Accountability
- Outcome: Effectiveness

Demonstrate accountability

- Document activities
- Document reason if something does not occur

What does this look like? *Quarterly reports CHAC meeting minutes*

Demonstrate effectiveness

□ Did you achieve your goal?

What does this look like?

Monitoring data sources

Keeping track of accomplishments

What then?

- Communicate your results
 - Back to your CHAC/other community partners
 - County Administrator
 - County Commissioners
 - Potential funding sources

Tailor your message to the audience

Expectations for evaluation during implementation

- State program will provide:
 - County data sheets
 - Special DATA requests
 - Technical assistance with gathering and presenting evaluation data
- County program will:
 - Follow local program plan
 - Submit quarterly reports
 - Respond to requests for data/participation in evaluation activities of overall program
