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

The Center for Health Statistics will soon remove several items from the Oregon report of live birth and the report of fetal death to comply with National reporting standards. By the end of this session you will know the date changes are scheduled to take effect, identify items no longer collected on reports of live birth & fetal death, recognize changes to the updated OVERS screens for birth & fetal death reports, locate updated birth & fetal death worksheets provided by the State & use them to replace facility-created worksheets. In addition, we'll show you about how you can access materials to help you with your work and who to contact with questions.



First let's take a look at the timelines for these changes and the impact it will have on your work.

Changes to birth and fetal death reporting

Effective October 1, 2014:

- Removing 9 items from the Oregon birth report
- Removing 5 items from the Oregon fetal death report
- Updated birth and fetal death worksheets available on the State website.

Beginning October 1, 2014 the Oregon Center for Health Statistics is removing 9 items from the birth report and 5 items from the fetal death report. Updated birth and fetal death worksheets with the items removed are available on the State website. The new worksheets were posted to our website on September 24th.

Why are reports changing?

- NCHS and all 50 States routinely review information on reports to determine quality and usefulness.
- Periodically remove questions that do not produce reliable data.
- Each State decides whether to discontinue collecting removed items.

Why are the reports changing? The information collected on the birth and fetal death reports is determined by the National Center for Health Statistics. Routinely NCHS works with vital records representatives from all 50 states to review information collected on these reports to determine the quality and usefulness of the data. Periodically NCHS removes questions that do not produce reliable data from the national datasets. Once national standards change each State decides when and whether to discontinue collecting the removed items. **{***Click}**

In summary there are 9 items being removed from the OVERS birth report screens: 1 item on the prenatal screen, 3 items on the pregnancy factors screen, 3 items on the labor screen and 2 items on the delivery screen.



In summary there are 5 items being removed from the OVERS fetal death report screens: 1 item on the prenatal screen, 2 items on the pregnancy factors screen, and 2 items on the delivery screen.


