


TB Cases and Incidence Oregon, 1983-2002




TB in the most affected Counties Oregon, 2002

Total of 4 counties	86	---	77%


TB Cases by Gender & Age Oregon, 2002




TB Cases by Race & Ethnicity Oregon, 2002



TB Case Rates by Race & Ethnicity Oregon, 2002




TB Cases by Origin Oregon 1993-2002




Foreign Born TB Cases by Country Oregon, 2002




Pediatric TB Cases Oregon, 1993-2002



TB/HIV Co-Morbidity Oregon, 1993-2002




Homelessness in TB Cases Oregon, 1993-2002




■ Homeless in year before TB diagnosis

TB Cases in Correctional Facilities Oregon 1998-2002





TB Drug Resistance Patterns Oregon 2002

- 2 (2%) Multi-drug resistant (MDR) cases
MDR = isoniazid (INH) and rifampin (RM) resistant
 - 14 (14%) Resistant to at least one TB drug
 - 10 (10%) at least INH resistant
 - Other drugs: streptomycin, pyrazinamide
- (n=99 culture positive cases)
