

Whom to test for Zika virus in Oregon

As a healthcare provider, you may want to consider testing your patient for Zika virus infection. The algorithm below will help you determine whether or not to test your patient for this infection. 
If your patient...

- Is experiencing or has recently experienced symptoms of Zika
- Is an asymptomatic pregnant woman*
- Has Guillain-Barré Syndrome

Symptoms of Zika

Rash
Joint pain
Fever
Red eyes

Ask the following questions:



*Pregnant or post-partum women with evidence of Zika-compatible abnormalities upon ultrasound or delivery may also be tested. Testing is **not recommended** for asymptomatic, non-pregnant individuals.

†For testing through OSPHL, specimens must be collected within 12 weeks of exposure.
