On November 23, 2009, the Oregon Department of Human Services, Public Health Division, Office of Environmental Public Health, Radiation Protection Services (RPS) issued a Notice of Violation and Proposed Imposition of Civil Penalty pursuant to Oregon Revised Statute ORS 431.950; Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) 333-119-0020, 333-103-0025, and 333-119-0140, proposing to impose a civil penalty against *The Face & Body Place* in the amount of **\$400** for violations of Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) listed in the Notice. The Notice offered Kristine Johnson, the owner of *The Face & Body Place*, an opportunity for hearing, if requested within 20 days of service of the Notice. The Notice designated the relevant portions of RPS' file on this matter, including all materials submitted by Ms. Johnson, as the record for purposes of default. Ms. Johnson did not request a hearing.

NOW THEREFORE, after considering the relevant portions of RPS' file relating to this matter, RPS enters the following Order.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Face & Body Place consist of tanning facilities at, 221 S Main Street, Ste 3, Pendleton, and has a total of 4 tanning devices.
2. On January 1, 2009, The Face & Body Place was required to pay to RPS a \$100 registration fee per tanning device, for a total of \$400 in registration fees. OAR 333-119-0020; 333-103-0025.

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3. Ms. Johnson was sent, to her address of record, three RPS payment notices and one certified letter regarding unpaid registration fees. In addition, the Department of Justice (DOJ) sent Ms. Johnson a letter advising her of potential civil penalties for failure to pay the outstanding registration fees within 10 days of the dated DOJ letter.
4. To date, RPS has not received any registration fees.

#### ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

The Face & Body Place has not paid its 2009 registration fees.

#### CONCLUSION OF LAW

The Face & Body Place violated OAR 333-103-0025 by failing to pay its 2009 registration fees.


#### ORDER

1. As authorized by ORS 431.950, The Face & Body Place shall pay a civil penalty of **\$400**, calculated as follows:

Violation(s) of OAR 333-103-0025: \$100 x 4 tanning device(s) = **\$400**

2. In addition to paying a civil penalty, The Face & Body Place shall pay the 2009 registration fees of \$400.
3. Failure to comply with this Order may subject The Face & Body Place, to further civil penalties.
