



Unintended Pregnancies Averted

Unintended pregnancies averted: Calculated by comparing the effectiveness of the birth control method used by a client before her first visit to the clinic and the method she used at the end of her most recent visit.

Your agency averted a total of:

12,364 unintended pregnancies, including:

3,412 Teen pregnancies (under age 20)

8,955 Adult pregnancies (20+)


% of female clients with an unintended pregnancy averted:

16.9% (vs. 10.1% statewide)

• In 2014, the average cost of an OHP delivery and the first year of infant healthcare costs was \$22,157.⁶ Nationally, approx. 42% of unintended pregnancies result in a live birth.⁷

• This means that approximate 5,193 unintended births were averted among your clients, resulting in taxpayer savings of \$115,061,301
