The ScreenWise Program helps low-income, uninsured, and medically underserved women gain access to lifesaving screening programs.







Provider Network


Enrolling Provider

- FQHC's, Local Health Departments, Rural Health Centers, Private Clinics, Naturopaths, Tribal Health Centers, County Clinics
- Provides screening office visits, care coordination and reports all results to ScreenWise.

Ancillary Provider

- Labs, Imaging Centers, Surgeons or Surgical Centers, Hospitals, County Clinics
- Provides services beyond the scope of an enrolling provider – labs, imaging, surgical procedures.
- Provides services, reports results to enrolling provider and bills ScreenWise for services.


Provider Role



Patient Eligibility

- Determined by the enrolling provider
- Self-declared by client
- **To be eligible for ScreenWise a person:**
 1. Lives in or intends to live in Oregon
 2. Household income at or below 250% of Federal Poverty Level
 3. Has no insurance **OR** has insurance, but not enough to cover the person's needs.


Priority Populations



ScreenWise Menu of Services

- All providers:
 - Collect family and personal health history for the client
 - Report height, weight, and blood pressure
- Services providers may offer:
 - Breast Cancer Screening Services
 - Cervical Cancer Screening Services
 - Genetic Screening and Referral for Hereditary Breast and Ovarian Cancer (HBOC)
 - Labs*
 - Heart Health Services*

Always Ask!

Heart disease is the leading cause of death for all women. Take the time to ask if they have been screened.

Agnes' Story



I immigrated to US in 1980 and was self-employed and worked all my life without any health insurance. During the 30 years, I was afraid to go to see a doctor or go to the hospital because of the high bills and I only went for emergencies.

Later, after I heard through family and friends about the Asian Health and Service Center women's health program, I was able to receive my first mammogram and Pap exam. The doctor was so comfortable and patient, and all the staff were very helpful and compassionate.

After receiving assistance and free women health screening for several years now, I am also helping as a volunteer interpreter for other women clients with their annual exams doctor visits.
