The CCare reimbursement rate chart for the quarter beginning January 1, 2016 is **attached** for your convenience, and is included in Exhibit C-8. As a reminder, CMS's recent revisions to the HCPCS code index now include specific codes for Mirena and Liletta. Effective January 1, 2016, CMS will discontinue the use of HCPCS code J7302 for 52mg levonorgestrel-releasing IUDs and begin using the following specific codes:

- Mirena – J7298, and
- Liletta – J7297.

Funded by a 5-year HHS, Office of Adolescent Health (OAH) cooperative agreement, the iTP₃ project aims to promote and support the development of innovative TPP programs targeting adolescents currently underserved by existing evidence-based programs. iTP₃ is specifically interested in programs that go beyond the standard evidence-based TPP format, and welcomes programs across all intervention levels and implementation settings.

Funding is available to support programs at different stages of development, ranging from innovative ideas to programs preparing for rigorous evaluation. Selected innovators will receive capacity building assistance (CBA), infrastructure, and evaluation services to assist with the development of their program. By the end of the 5-year funding award, the iTP₃ project team expects to have identified a group of promising programs that are ready for rigorous evaluation.
