- Budget –

 - SPO staffing - increase administrative support to 1 FTE.



KPM Workgroup Update

- Goals:
 1. Review current KPMs
 2. Determine if current KPMs should be revised/eliminated
 3. Identify KPMs that should be added, if any
- Meetings:
 - Three held in Fall 2014
 - Final work session held early February 2015

Potential KPM changes

- Eliminate 3+ visit requirement
- Provide “menu” of KPM options:
 - “Core” measures (MUST choose both):
 1. Well care visit
 2. Comprehensive health assessment
 - Optional measures (choose one):
 - Full list TBA
- Provide guidance documents for each measure
- Provide technical assistance and training

KPM changes will be finalized in Spring 2015






“UB” Modifier

- Issue: SBHC claims cannot be identified separately in DMAP data
- Solution: Procedure Code Modifier (UB) for all OHP services delivered in SBHCs
- Process:
 - SPO Letter to SBHCs
 - DMAP Memo to CCOs/Providers
 - Contact with CCOs

OPAL-K Mission Statement

The mission of OPAL-K is to expand the availability of timely, high-quality mental health treatment to youth in Oregon through support of the patient-centered medical home.

When did OPAL-K start taking Calls?

- June 18, 2014!
- Calls taken 223
(06/18/2014-01/22/2015)
- Enrollments 788

Presently OPAL-K is

- A program that provides same day phone consultation for psychiatric questions
- A program that provides evidence-based practice data support to primary care clinicians in need of psychiatric treatment information
- A program that provides practical advice to clinicians providing mental health care in the medical home of Coordinated Care Organizations (CCOs)

OPAL-K is not...

- A substitute for emergency room assessment of psychiatric emergencies
- A substitute for inpatient psychiatric care or referrals
- A substitute for community mental health clinic programs providing specialty care to special needs youth
- A program that just focuses on medication issues

Why OPAL-K?

- OPAL-K can help reduce the number of children who do not receive treatment for their psychiatric disorders and eliminate long delays for treatment.
- OPAL-K model is based on proven programs presently used in other states (WA, MA, MN).
- Outcome data from these programs show clear benefit to both patients and their primary care clinicians.





OSBHA Legislation

- SB 336: Parity – All SBHCs receive \$60,000 per year. **Senator Monnes Anderson**
- SB 338: Additional Planning grants. **Senator Monnes Anderson**
- HB 2626: Grants to school districts for acquisition, construction or improvement of SBHCs. **Rep. Reardon**
- LC 2939: Require CCOs to work with SBHCs and educational entities. **Senator Monnes Anderson**

Core Grants 2015-2016


The CORE grant program seeks to assist school-based health centers (SBHCs) as they work with school-aged youth to develop healthy relationship skills and knowledge, with a specific focus on social and sexual health.

Projects should have a budget up to \$10,000 and must be achievable within a one-year timeframe (School year 2015-2016).

The CORE RFA will have several menu options, including approximate budget and staff capacity required to complete the project

Menu options will be aligned with core health education concepts to help facilitate dialogue with teachers and school administration who may participate in the project

Menu options will allow OSBHA to provide streamlined technical assistance to CORE grantees, as well as promote collaborative working relationships between CORE grantees





Core Grants 2015-2016

Eligible applicants are:

Certified school-based health centers in the State of Oregon or
Single sites or multiple site systems, or
Planning sites

AND

Current members of the Oregon School-Based Health Alliance.

OSBHA will release the CORE RFA in early February 2015; grantee notification will be in April 2015

If you are interested in doing a short project ***this spring (2015)*** there may be funding available (e.g., Healthy Youth Relationship awareness campaigns prior to/during prom)
