

## Tests allowed under Oregon's Health Screen Testing Permit

An Oregon laboratory may obtain a Health Screen Testing (HST) Permit which allows the performance of the following tests without a clinician's order:

- Blood hemoglobin
- Packed red cell volume
- Total cholesterol
- Blood glucose
- Blood in feces
- Human chorionic gonadotropin
- HDL
- Triglyceride after an individual fasts 12 to 16 hours
- LDL using the Friedenwald automatic calculation equation

In addition, verify that your test system complies with your CLIA certificate type. For instance, a CLIA Waived laboratory can perform only waived tests. To verify that your test system has been approved as waived, go to the FDA's website for approved waived analytes at:
