

Secondhand smoke

Secondhand smoke kills an estimated 650 Oregonians each year. In addition to the health risks associated with exposure to secondhand smoke, smoking in the home or in public locations can normalize smoking behavior for youth. Most exposure to secondhand smoke occurs in homes and in workplaces that are not covered under the Oregon Indoor Clean Air Act.


Although 91 percent of Oregon adults report that no one is allowed to smoke inside the home, more than one-quarter of eighth- and 11th-grade nonsmoking students live with someone who smokes.

Nearly 200,000 Oregon adults are still exposed to secondhand smoke while working in places where smoking may not be prohibited, such as food service (outdoor dining areas), hotels, casinos, home care and construction.

We are pleased to report that no-smoking rules are being adopted by colleges and universities. Because these schools are updating their policies so frequently, it is not feasible to attempt to display the policies in this document. Please navigate to






No-smoking rules in the home by Oregon county, 2008-2011


