1) One dose of Hib vaccine is available for unimmunized high-risk children ages 5 through 18 years, with either functional or anatomical asplenia (SSD, post-splenectomy); immunodeficiency; HIV infection; or immunosuppression due to HIV infection or chemotherapy.

2) MCV4 (Menactra™ and Menveo®), & MPSV4 (Menomune®) Vaccines: Routine vaccination of all persons aged 11 through 18 years with 1 dose of either of the MCV4 conjugate vaccines, at the earliest opportunity, is preferred over MPSV4. Persons aged 11 and 12 years should be routinely vaccinated at the pre-adolescent health-care visit as recommended by ACIP. Booster doses are available as prescribed by ACIP. MCV4 vaccines are also available and for high-risk children and adolescents as outlined in standing orders.

Meningococcal B Vaccines (Bexsero® and Trumenba®): Available by clinician recommendation for adolescents ages 16 through 18 years. Vaccines are also available for high risk children ages 10 years through 18 years as outlined in standing orders.

3) Pneumococcal Polysaccharide (23-valent) vaccine is available for high-risk children 2 years through 18 years as outlined in standing orders.
